Derald Wing Sue, Professor of Psychology and Education,
Teachers College, Columbia University**

Diversity and inclusion remain among the biggest challenges facing universities nationwide. While examples of overt discrimination and racism are clear to the eye, it is the microaggressions on campus and in the classroom that have a tremendous negative impact on campus climate and culture. Subtle and seemingly unbiased comments, insults and jokes woven into everyday dialogue function as microaggressions. They are as destructive as direct racist remarks and have a profound negative impact upon students and faculty of color. In this special keynote event, Dr. Derald Wing Sue will discuss microaggression theory and the impact of microaggressions in higher education.

Derald Wing Sue is a pioneer in the field of multicultural psychology, multicultural education, microaggression theory, the psychology of racial dialogues, multicultural counseling and therapy, and the psychology of racism/antiracism. He has done extensive multicultural research and writing in psychology and education which paved the way for a generation of younger scholars interested in issues of minority mental health and multicultural psychology. In all of these endeavors, his commitment to multiculturalism has been obvious and his contributions have forced the field to seriously question the monocultural knowledge base of its theories and practices. Dr. Sue's book *Counseling the Culturally Diverse: Theory and Practice, 2016* has been identified as the most frequently cited publication in the multicultural field. With the help of many colleagues, he has chaired committees for the Society of Counseling Psychology and the Association for Multicultural Counseling and Development, laying the foundations for the cultural competency movement.
